BEYOND THE CITY

HOCKING HILLS STATE PARK, OHIO

Known for its incredible sandstone cliffs, hidden caves, and waterfalls, the park offers trails ranging from relaxed walks to heart-pumping hikes. RED RIVER GORGE, KENTUCKY

LOUISVILLE, KENTUCKY

Baseball lovers can't miss the Louisville Slugger Museum, easily recognized by its giant baseball bat outside. LEXINGTON & VERSAILLES, KY

Nearby, Castle & Key Distillery offers tours in a beautifully restored, castle-like facility, and Buffalo Trace in nearby Frankfort provides another fascinating bourbon experience. This region perfectly combines sipping Kentucky's finest spirits with exploring storied horse farms and scenic drives through breathtaking landscapes.
