Green Bay, Wisconsin, blends a rich cultural heritage with iconic attractions, making it an appealing destination for adult travelers and families. Adjacent to the amusement park, Bay Beach Wildlife Sanctuary offers serene walking trails and wildlife viewing opportunities, ideal for nature enthusiasts. The CityDeck, a vibrant riverfront promenade downtown, provides excellent views of the Fox River and hosts numerous seasonal events. At the same time, the nearby Fox River State Trail appeals to cyclists and pedestrians seeking scenic adventures.

To round out your Green Bay experience, explore the city's thriving culinary and nightlife scene. Indulge in classic Wisconsin fare with a visit to local favorites such as Kroll's West, known for its iconic butter burgers, or enjoy the nostalgic charm of Al's Hamburger Shop, serving the community since the 1930s. Those craving a sophisticated evening can dine at Chefusion, known for inventive dishes served in a stylish setting. The city's vibrant brewing culture is exemplified by Titledown Brewing Co., a lively brewery with an inviting rooftop patio, and Hinterland Brewery, renowned for creative beers, steps away from Lambeau Field. Whether you're sipping cocktails at cozy lounges or catching live music at lively bars, Green Bay offers an engaging nightlife perfect for capping off a memorable day.

## BEYOND THE CITY

---

### **DOOR COUNTY, WISCONSIN**

Just an hour's drive northeast, Door County is known for its charming coastal villages and stunning natural beauty. Enjoy hiking and biking along the forested trails and dramatic cliffs of Peninsula State Park, explore Cave Point County Park with its picturesque limestone bluffs and hidden sea caves, or unwind on the soft sands of Whitefish Dunes State Park overlooking Lake Michigan. For a truly remote experience, ferry out to Rock Island State Park, where you'll find historical sites, including Wisconsin's oldest lighthouse, amid serene hiking trails and breathtaking lake views.

### **POTAWATOMI STATE PARK, WISCONSIN**

Located roughly one hour from Green Bay near Sturgeon Bay, Potawatomi State Park invites visitors to explore its lush landscapes, rugged cliffs, and scenic trails. Home to the eastern terminus of the Ice Age National Scenic Trail, this park offers excellent hiking opportunities through dense forests and along the rocky shoreline. Visitors can also enjoy fishing, canoeing, and boating on Green Bay's peaceful waters, making it ideal for outdoor enthusiasts seeking relaxation and adventure.

### **MANITOWOC, WISCONSIN**

Approximately forty-five minutes southeast in Manitowoc, the Wisconsin Maritime Museum presents an engaging exploration of Great Lakes maritime history. Visitors can tour the USS Cobia, a fully restored WWII submarine, gaining firsthand insight into the lives of submariners. The museum features fascinating exhibits highlighting regional shipbuilding heritage, interactive displays, and shipwrecked artifacts, providing an intriguing look into Wisconsin's rich nautical past.

### **WAUSAU, WISCONSIN**

Roughly an hour and a half west of Green Bay, Wausau combines outdoor recreation with city charm. Rib Mountain State Park, home to one of Wisconsin's tallest hills, offers panoramic views, picturesque hiking trails, and, in winter, Granite Peak Ski Area, one of the region's premier ski destinations. After outdoor adventures, explore downtown Wausau's scenic Riverwalk, where pathways meander along the Wisconsin River, showcasing public art, lush parks, and tranquil riverside views.

### **SHEBOYGAN, WISCONSIN**

About a ninety-minute drive southeast, Sheboygan blends beautiful Lake Michigan scenery with a vibrant cultural scene. Spend the day exploring Kohler-Andrae State Park's sandy beaches, sprawling dunes, and peaceful wooded trails, perfect for hiking and relaxation. Afterward, discover downtown Sheboygan's artistic side at the acclaimed John Michael Kohler Arts Center, famous for its innovative contemporary art exhibits and uniquely decorated interior. Round out your trip by enjoying lakeside dining or browsing local boutiques in this inviting coastal town.

### **APPLETON, WISCONSIN**

Just over half an hour southwest, Appleton offers a delightful mix of history, shopping, and culture. Visit the History Museum at the Castle to explore engaging exhibits on local heritage and hometown legend Harry Houdini, complete with interactive magic displays. Afterward, stroll downtown Appleton's bustling College Avenue, lined with independent shops, cozy cafés, and charming galleries. Shoppers can also head to Fox River Mall, one of Wisconsin's largest shopping centers, featuring an impressive array of stores and dining options, providing a balanced day of cultural immersion and leisurely retail therapy.
